WEDNESDAY

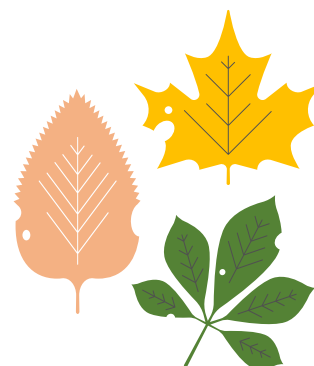

THE BIBLE SAYS...

A ROMAN CENTURION SAID... "Surely, this man was the Son of God" (Mark 15:39). A roman centurion was the commander of a century, which was a unit of a roman legion, consisting of one hundred soldiers. A centurion would have been battle tested and elevated to this rank because of his bravery and loyalty. Pontius Pilate released Jesus to be crucified under the oversight of this centurion, who probably was assigned to Jesus as soon as He arrived at Pilate's headquarters. This would mean that he was the commander who oversaw the scourging of Jesus and allowed His humiliating mistreatment from the Roman soldiers. As he was charged with the crucifixion of Jesus, he was very observant during these proceedings and saw and heard every detail.

The scriptures say he stood facing Jesus when He said, "It is finished," and breathed his last breath. He saw the way Jesus remained silent during His tremendous suffering. He heard all the things Jesus said on the cross. Jesus may have been looking at him when He asked the Father to forgive them. He had experienced the miraculous darkness that covered the land from noon until Jesus died at 3:00pm. He felt the earthquake. He saw the rocks split and the bodies of fallen saints come out of their graves. This roman centurion had nothing against Jesus personally. He was just doing his job. But when he experienced all these things, he simply said, "Surely, this man was the Son of God." His eyes were opened. He refused to do what so many people did on that day and do even to this day: deny the undeniable. May we be ever observant of God's word and the testimonies of these eyewitnesses. Let us be mindful to never deny the undeniable fact that Jesus is the Son of God who suffered and died for the forgiveness of our sins.
