About this we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. Hebrews 5:11

THE BIBLE SAYS...

JESUS SAID..."This people's heart has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely hear, and their eyes they have closed." (Matthew 13:15). Jesus said this about those who were rejecting the call of the gospel. He quotes this from what Isaiah had earlier prophesied. In the days of Isaiah, the people had closed their ears to the hearing of the Word of God. It was happening again during the time Jesus was teaching. Also, the Apostle Paul, as he proclaimed the gospel to the Jewish leaders in Rome, applied this to them in Acts 28, "The Holy Spirit rightly spoke through Isaiah the prophet to your fathers, saying, 'Go to this people and say, "You will keep on hearing, but will not understand; And you will keep on seeing, but will not perceive; For the heart of this people has become dull, And with their ears they scarcely hear, and they have closed their eyes."

Such is the nature of the Word of God. It makes us choose. We can either listen and obey or refuse and rebel. God's desire is that it would soften our hearts and mold us into holy people, who seek to please Him. Even after we become followers of Christ, we can become dull of hearing. After warnings and exhortations to pay attention to God's word, the Hebrew writer told the Hebrew Christians that they had become dull of hearing. Jesus continued In Matthew 13, speaking to His disciples, "If only they would see and hear and understand and turn to me, I would heal them. But blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear." Are we listening to the most important truths we will ever hear? Let us not become dull of hearing.
