The Rible Says

Apostle Paul said, "I press on toward the goal unto the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14). Mount Everest is one of the most difficult climbs in the world. The peak is over 29,000 feet above sea level. At that altitude, the air pressure is about a third of what it is at sea level, which reduces the amount of oxygen in the air for climbers. At this height, winds of over 100 mph are common. In February 2004, a wind speed of 175 mph was recorded at the summit. These winds can blow climbers off the mountain. There is a constant risk of freezing, avalanches, and icefalls.

God has called us to a much higher summit than that of Mount Everest. He has called us to His own glory and excellence. We were once lost in the darkness of our own sin, and God has called us out of this into His marvelous light. We have been called to ascend the steep slope of this glorious mountain. This is rarefied air. No worldly creature can withstand the elements on this summit. It is a drastic and difficult contrast to the environment of this world. It requires a radical change in our mind set and our behaviors. King David said in Psalm 24:3-4, "Who may ascend the hill of the LORD? Who may stand in His holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart." It is not an easy ascent but as Paul described, we must press on toward the goal unto the prize that awaits us at these lofty heights. The prize is worth the climb. By God's marvelous grace, we can escape the corruption of the world and ascend to the glorious summit of our God in Jesus Christ.
