THE BIBLE SAYS

King Solomon said, "A cord of three strands is not quickly broken (Ecclesiastes 4:12). Togetherness can be defined as a feeling of satisfaction in being united with other people for a specific purpose. Simply being in close physical proximity with a crowd of people does not create that feeling of togetherness. Rather, it is a spirit of unity that results in minds that agree, creating togetherness. Solomon expounds on his comment, "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves."

Togetherness is one of the most important themes in the New Testament. In Jesus' longest recorded prayer, He prayed that His followers would "be one as you and I, Father, are one." The apostle Paul pleaded with the churches in many of his epistles to "preserve the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace." He also listed several Christian virtues and then said in Colossians 3:14, "...over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

The opposite of togetherness is dissension and strife, which the Bible strongly condemns. Divisions within the body of Christ halt God's work through us and turn our focus inward rather than outward toward others. Christ's church consists of believers who have been baptized into one body. In Christ's body, our concerns focus no longer on self, but on the good of the whole body (1 Corinthians 12:7-13). When we work together, rather than each one seeking his or her own agenda, we accomplish more for God's kingdom. Togetherness in spirit, with Christ as our Head, is God's ideal for His family. "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity" (Psalm 133:1)!
