## THE BIBLE SAYS

Jesus said, "The Father will honor anyone who serves Me" (John 12:26). Honor is a word that has faded in modern culture, yet it remains central to biblical Christianity. Scripture calls believers not only to give honor, but to live honorably, and it promises that God honors those who honor Him. These ideas are deeply connected and reveal what true Christian character looks like. In the Old Testament, the primary word for honor carries the idea of weight or heaviness. To honor someone is to treat them as weighty — as significant and valuable. To honor God means we treat Him as highest and most central in our lives. His Word carries weight in our decisions. His Will shapes our priorities. His authority governs our conduct.

The New Testament continues this theme. Christians are commanded to show respect and dignity toward others. We are told to honor all people, certainly our parents and even all authorities. Scripture also calls us to live honorably. 1 Peter 2:12 urges believers to maintain honorable conduct among unbelievers. Hebrews 13:18 speaks of desiring to live honorably in all things. Living honorably does not mean protecting a reputation but cultivating integrity. It means to always think, speak, and act in honesty, fairness, purity, and humility even when no one is watching.

There is a beautiful progression in Scripture: we honor God and others; we commit ourselves to honorable living; and God, in His time, honors those who are faithful. In a culture that often celebrates self-promotion, excuses, and compromise, servants of Jesus are different. We must examine our lives. Does God truly carry weight in my daily choices? Would others describe my conduct as honorable? Do my words and actions reflect integrity in all facets of my life? Honor begins in the heart but is proven in conduct. When we treat God with weighty honor, we will treat people as valuable and live honorable lives. And when we live that way, we can rest in this promise: the Father we honor will one day honor those who faithfully serve the Son.
